Building Better Regions Fund boosts Dalby

- **Dalby to receive \$39,250 for two community projects: WEstern DOWns Food and Fibre Festival (\$25,000) and Dalby on the Catwalk (\$14,250).**
- **Fund supports key community projects in regional and remote communities.**
- **Nationwide, 147 projects will share in \$6.9 million which spurs and extra \$5.4 million in investment.**

FUNDING to help cement Dalby and the Western Downs as a go-to tourism destination has been secured under the Coalition Government's Building Better Regions Fund, announced today.

Maranoa MP David Littleproud said the Western Downs Council and the Dalby Welcoming Committee would receive a total of \$39,250 for two community projects in our region.

"We know our region's vibrant and exciting and this Building Better Regions funding will help the Western Downs to better promote and organise events in the region," Mr Littleproud said.

"The Western Downs Council secured \$25,000 for the WEstern DOWns Food and Fibre Festival to promote local goods and services. It's anticipated 10,000 people would attend – with 50% of visitors from outside the region – establishing a strong foundation to grow as a future bi-annual event.

"Dalby on the Catwalk – organised by the Dalby Welcoming Committee – secured \$14,250 to host a multicultural fashion parade to promote our region and engage with young people.

"A recent Tourism Research Australia survey found domestic and international tourism spending has hit a record of \$121 billion dollars. This is great news for the Australian economy, workers and small business so I anticipate this funding will help our region to grab a larger piece of this tourism action.

"Without the Building Better Regions Fund, community investment projects – such as these two on the Western Downs – often struggle for funding but this government has invested \$168,525 for six projects in my electorate."

Minister for Regional Development Fiona Nash said the Building Better Regions Fund Community Investment Stream was investing \$6.9 million in community projects throughout regional Australia.

“I aim to help build the kinds of regional communities our children and grandchildren either want to stay in or come back to and this project will help to do that,” Minister Nash said.

The Building Better Regions Fund is investing \$500 million to foster economic growth in rural, regional, and remote communities.
