Building Better Regions Fund boosts Winton

- **Winton Shire Council to receive \$46,350 for a strategic Tourism and Economic Development Plan to take the Outback region towards 2030.**
- **Fund supports key community projects in regional and remote communities.**
- **Nationwide, 147 projects will share in \$6.9 million which spurs and extra \$5.4 million in investment.**

FUNDING to create a strategic Tourism and Economic Development Plan to help cement Winton's place as a go-to visitor destination has been secured under the Coalition Government's Building Better Regions Fund, announced today.

Maranoa MP David Littleproud said the Winton Shire Council will receive \$46,350 to develop a road map to take the region towards 2030.

"This plan will focus not only on business opportunities for retail and tourism, but also will give consideration to new opportunities – for existing and new business – to promote population growth and long-term sustainability of the region," Mr Littleproud said.

"Winton has been devastated by five years of drought and the fire which destroyed its major tourist attraction, the Waltzing Matilda Centre in 2015 so this Building Better Regions funding will help the region move towards the future.

"This region is home to a stoic community, ready to overcome adversity and become a tourism focal point with the Waltzing Matilda Centre currently being rebuilt – thanks to \$8 million in Federal Government funding – and the Australian Age of Dinosaurs is undergoing massive expansion.

"A recent Tourism Research Australia survey found domestic and international tourism spending has hit a record of \$121 billion dollars. This is great news for the Australian economy, workers and small business so I anticipate this funding will help our region to grab a larger piece of this tourism action.

"Without the Building Better Regions Fund, community investment projects – such as this project for Winton – often struggle for funding but this government has invested \$168,525 for six projects in my electorate."

Minister for Regional Development Fiona Nash said the Building Better Regions Fund Community Investment Stream was investing \$6.9 million in community projects throughout regional Australia.

“I aim to help build the kinds of regional communities our children and grandchildren either want to stay in or come back to and this project will help to do that,” Minister Nash said.

The Building Better Regions Fund is investing \$500 million to foster economic growth in rural, regional, and remote communities.

Provide quality town planning and plot future population and housing growth. 4. The delivery of future community infrastructure growth especially in the areas of power, water and sewerage. 5. Objective outlooks into the long term transportation needs and maintenance. 6. The long term growth in tourism that can be expected due to the development of new accommodation infrastructure and tourism attractions presently unfolding.
WEstern DOWns Food and Fibre Festival	Western Downs Regional Council (Dalby)	\$25,000	\$50,000	The WEstern DOWns Food & Fibre Festival is a free community festival that celebrates the contribution of our local agricultural and creative industries by showcasing the end products in the form of a signature dish competition, fashion show, artisan workshops and markets. An anticipated 10,000 people are expected to attend this event, establishing strong foundations for which to grow as a future bi-annual event.

The plan will focus on not only business opportunities for the commercial retail assets and tourism, but also will give consideration to new business opportunities for both existing and new business enterprises that delivers people who will increase the long term population growth and long term quality and sustainability of the communities.
